#WhyIStayed #WhyILeft— The Lived Experience of Staying and Leaving Abusive Relationships in 140 Characters, *Co-Investigator* 4/2015-present

The goal of this study is to investigate the content, sentiment, meaning making processes, and discursive properties of Twitter messages that use the twitter hashtags: #WhyIStayed and #WhyILeft (n=50,000). The methodological approach includes the utilization of supervised machine learning strategies to analyze “big data,” coupled with inductive qualitative analysis approaches to triangulate findings.

Doctoral Mentoring Study, *Co-Investigator* 10/2013-present

This qualitative study seeks to understand how faculty conceptualize and define mentoring relationships and to explore the institutional supports and barriers for positive mentoring with doctoral students within the University of Washington School of Social Work. Involvement included study design, attaining human subjects approval, qualitative data collection, analysis, and dissemination.

University of Washington Bystander Research Study, *Co-Investigator* 06/2011-Present

This study seeks to identify and contextualize the multilevel factors that contribute to youths’ willingness to intervene in instances of dating abuse or bullying among their peers. Participation included collaborating on study design, attaining human subjects approval, program staff training and support, the development and refinement of interview guides, participant recruitment, focus group facilitation, data cleaning, analysis, and dissemination.

Lehigh Longitudinal Study, *NIMH Prevention Trainee* 9/2011-2013

Supported research staff in multiple projects to investigate the relationship between adverse early child events and victimization in adulthood. Responsibilities included scaling conflict tactics scale measures, reviewing qualitative data, contributing during analysis team meetings, reviewing conference abstracts and proceedings, and preparing manuscripts.

Mobilizing Men Violence Prevention (MMVP), University of Washington, University of Michigan, and University of Minnesota, *Pre-Doctoral Researcher* 9/2011-Present

MMVP is a multiphase mixed-methods research project aiming to describe and measure the nature and extent of efforts to engage men in preventing violence against women and girls. Collaborative duties included performing qualitative analysis of key informant interviews, participating in manuscript preparation and dissemination, and developing and implementing an international online survey.

Research Assistant/Pre-Doctoral Researcher

Participated in the initial phases of a research project designed to adapt an evidence-based parenting program for families involved in the child welfare system. Involvement included overseeing the human subjects review, recruiting research participants, facilitating youth focus groups, analyzing qualitative data, training and supporting BASW- and MSW-level research assistants, and disseminating research findings.

Collaborated with community-based organization on developing an online survey and conducting key informant interviews to assess the implementation of voluntary recommendations to improve the coordinated response to domestic violence.
