Obtaining an MSW is only the first step. A new MSW graduate will want to pursue licensure in whatever state they live. In Louisiana, there are three levels of licensure for social workers in Louisiana:

License	Requirements and Scope of Practice
Registered Social Worker (RSW)	Requires a BSW or MSW and application to the Board.
	 Agency based Generalist practice
Licensed Master Social Worker or	Requires MSW and exam; application to the Board
Certified Social Worker (LMSW or CSW)	 Agency based, supervised practice.
	 May not engage in private practice.
	 May engage in psychotherapy under the
	supervision of a LCSW.
Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW)*	Requires MSW; 5760 hours of postgraduate practice
	with 3840 hours of supervision; exam; application to the
	Board
	 Independent advanced social work practice
	either in an agency or private practice

^{*}The LCSW can also obtain a LCSW-BACS (Board Approved Clinical Supervisor) license

A Requirement for Maintaining Licensure: Social Work CEUS

To maintain one's license in Louisiana, twenty (20) hours of social work continuing education is required annually prior to the renewal of a license, certification, provisional certification or registration. The collection period for continuing education is July 1 through June 30 of each year.

- All social workers are required to obtain three (3) hours in the area of social work ethics every two years.
- LCSWs are required to obtain ten (10) of the twenty (20) hours in the area of clinical social work to include diagnosis and treatment annually.
- LCSW-BACS are required to obtain three (3) hours in the area of clinical supervision every two years to maintain Board Approved Clinical Supervisor (BACS) designation
